Message from the **President**

As I write this article we are in the election mode, in Israel, the US

and here at home. World Zionist Organization (WZO) also plans to hold elections in 2010, to elect delegates to attend its Congress where decisions on important issues are made and monetary resources are allocated. Canada through the Canadian Zionist Federation - is allocated 19 delegates and this number is split amongst the various organizations under its umbrella. A vote is held and the number of seats allocated to any particular organization is based on its membership and the number of members who vote. This is not unlike political parties here in Canada. When someone is running for the leader of a party his/her success is determined by the number of members his/her team can get to join and then assuring that they all vote.

The political team for Mercaz-Canada is our Board of Directors. It is our job to recruit every member of a Conservative synagogue into our ranks and to make sure every member votes. However we can't do this alone. WE NEED YOUR HELP. In order to be eligible to vote in the WZO elections you must be a member in 2009. Membership dues received from December 1, 2008 onward will be applied to 2009.

Membership is only \$9.00 per person or \$18.00 per couple annually. Please join the thousands of Conservative Jews who are making a commitment by:

Remember to include your email address. This is essential to ensure that we can easily communicate with you as we approach the election.

Conservative / Masorti Institutions in Israel do not get the level of government funding Orthodox institutions do. The only opportunity for our

movement to receive major funding is through the WZO where our delegates, whose numbers are determined by the size of our membership, have a voice in the funding decision-making process. (Please refer to David Breakstone's article to appreciate all of the benefits Mercaz receives worldwide). Mercaz is the only Zionist group that supports and advocates for the Conservative/Masorti Movement.

In November I will be attending the WZO, Vaad Hapoel (General Council) and Jewish Agency Assembly in Israel as a Mercaz Olami delegate. I look forward to sharing the deliberations with you when I return (another reason for giving us your email address).

With your help and support we know that our Movement in Israel will continue to grow and flourish.

MERCAZ Matters

Over the weekend of September 12-14, 2008, 57 members of Masorti/Conservative kehillot from eight countries throughout Europe convened in London to participate in a Leadership Development Seminar. Five years ago, such a gathering would have been impossible. Many of the congregations represented simply did not exist then, nor did the funds to bring them together. The worldwide organization of Mercaz—MERCAZ Olami—is the vehicle which made this remarkable growth and vital networking possible. The ability of MERCAZ to be of such assistance is entirely a function of our political clout within the World Zionist Organization (WZO).

While the existence of Conservative congregations in Melbourne, Johannesburg, Nice, Rio de Janeiro, Guadalajara, Budapest, Prague, Kiev, Paris, London and Delhi (to name but a few) is a major achievement due primarily to the dedication of their lay leaders, the support available from MERCAZ Olami has also been key. Funds generated by MERCAZ have enabled the Jerusalem office to send rabbis to congregations around the world, as well as to offer support to rabbinical students training to serve them. We have also provided seed money for numerous educational initiatives, purchased siddurim, trained shlichei tzibur, and sent Israeli shlichim (educational emissaries) to work with our communities, in particular with NOAM, our burgeoning youth movement and MAROM our young adult division. The efforts and successes of our next generation are not only assuring the future of Conservative Judaism, but also revitalizing the broader Jewish community in the process.

As a consequence of our influence within the WZO, we have also been able to secure appointments

to the Executive, Board of Governors, and standing committees of the Jewish Agency (JAFI), as well as assuring an annual allocation of nearly \$1.7million for the advancement of Masorti Judaism within Israel - without which we would be crippled.

MERCAZ, however, is not only about generating funding; it is also about impacting the agenda and influencing policy of world Jewry. One outstanding contribution in this regard is within Keren Kayemeth Lelsrael/KKL (the Jewish National Fund). As a result of our political representation within the WZO, we were entitled to nominate 10% of the KKL directorate who are utilizing their posts to make real and tangible contributions to eco-Zionism.

We are also impacting on Government and Jewish Agency policy regarding such matters as conversion, Who is a Jew, aliya by choice, and the development of an institutional infrastructure for the 1.5 million Jews in the FSU. Due to our alliance with Kadima within the WZO, we have ongoing contact with prominent members of Knesset and

our opinions and needs are regularly heard within the Prime Minister's office. This coalition is itself the direct result of the increased strength of MERCAZ following the last elections to the Zionist Congress in 2006. Kadima, a new party at the time, without any representation outside of Israel, sought us out as a strategic partner with a worldwide presence and an ideology comfortably complementing its own.

MERCAZ, in all of these ways, has succeeded in being the voice of Conservative Judaism in the one and only international arena where the entire political and religious spectrum of world Jewry convenes. However, how loudly we are able to speak, with what moral authority and to what effect, depends on YOU.

IMPORTANT UPDATE: When the Jews of the Former Soviet Union celebrate Israel **Independence Day** next year with Jewish Agency funding, it is going to be because of MERCAZ - but they won't know that. Neither would you, if you didn't happen to be reading this update. As a result of the strength of MERCAZ at the last Congress, and his own sterling reputation, Rabbi Vernon Kurtz, our international president, was asked to fill the prestigious position of Chair of the JAFI **FSU Committee.** The important ongoing work he has been doing has greatly enhanced the stature of MERCAZ in the eyes of JAFI powerbrokers, and Rabbi Kurtz was recently able to use his position to avert a planned budgetary cut that would have left the Jews in the former Soviet Union without adequate funds for programs and activities that directly enhance their ties to Israel.
